### **SCHOOL PICTURE DAY**

Reminder: Save Thursday, October 6 for School Picture Day. Images 4 Kids will be taking individual photos of all enrolled children in our school atrium on this day. There is no prepayment necessary. Proofs will be available at the school approximately 3-4 weeks following picture day. You may purchase photo packages at that time. Due to time restrictions, all currently enrolled sibling photos will be taken *after* all individual photos have been taken first.

If your child is absent on picture day, there will be ONE make-up picture day for children from all four schools on Wednesday, October 19 at our Westpark Montessori beginning at 9:00 a.m. and only as long as needed. Parents are responsible for transporting their child to and from Westpark for the make-up picture day.

### **UPDATE REMINDER . . .**

Please remember to **update** your child's ID EMERGENCY information at the front desk. Updated information includes if you have moved, changed jobs, or changed **any** phone numbers or people with permission to pick up your child. Please remember to also update your child's immunization record if they have received any new vaccinations or health information. Thank you.

October book club orders are now available at the front desk. Orders are due Friday, October 7. Please write **ONE** check only to "Scholastic reading club" for all orders when paying by check. The book club deliveries do not always arrive on the same date, so orders will be distributed as they arrive. (Please allow 3-4 weeks for delivery).



## PUMPKIN PATCH FIELD TRIP

Again this fall we will be traveling to Tanaka Farms Pumpkin Patch and vegetable gardens, located in Irvine. The Tanaka Farms Pumpkin Patch allows children to pick their own pumpkins right off the vines. The field trip also includes a wagon ride, petting zoo and a corn maze! The field trip to Tanaka Farms will take place on Thursday, October 13. The cost of the trip is \$21.00 for children and the entrance fee for parent chaperones is \$7.00 (The chaperone fee does NOT include a pumpkin.)

Permission slips were distributed last month. Preschool children under 4 must have a parent chaperone! Registration is done on a first come/first serve basis and the trip will close once the bus is full. **All children attending must wear a Montessori rainbow t-shirt!** Tennis shoes or closed toed shoes are suggested, as it makes walking in the pumpkin patch field easier to navigate.

Parent chaperones: Please bring a back pack and also wear "comfy" shoes for walking in the pumpkin patch. As always, we ask that you turn off your cell phones while chaperoning on this trip. Thank you.



## ANNUAL HALLOWEEN PARTY AND PARADE

Our annual Halloween party and parade has been scheduled for **Monday, October 31 at 3:30 p.m.** Parents are invited to sign up in the front office to bring in special Halloween goodies on this day and we will also ask for two parent volunteers from each classroom to assist the teachers with costume changing. Sign-ups will be posted in the front office on Wednesday, October 19.

Children should come to school with their **school clothes on** and their costume in a **PAPER bag**. The bag and **ALL parts of the costume must be labeled** with your child's name. Please be aware that regrettably, sometimes even with labeling, mix-ups can occur! Children will be dressed in their costumes following their afternoon snack.

**Please, NO MASKS! Masks frighten many young children.**

Parents are welcome to join us for the parade, which takes place in the parking lot. The parking lot (and drop off area) will be blocked off from 2:30 – 4:30. PLEASE, DO NOT park in the lot as the children will use the parking lot for the parade! Find your "photo spot" and wait for the children to reach you. They will be pausing periodically for photos along the way.

We must ask all parents to wait OUTSIDE and keep the atrium and entrance area clear at all times, as the children will be proceeding to the parade through these areas. Classrooms are also limited in space and parents will be asked to stay in the parade area (parking lot) only. All pictures and videos must be taken outside during the parade. Following the parade, children will be directly behind their classrooms for a quick group photo and then return to their rooms. (see "dismissal"). Thank you for your cooperation!

**\*DISMISSAL:** Parents who are taking their children with them after the parade are asked to PLEASE WAIT OUTSIDE until all children have returned to their classrooms for dismissal so that we can keep them safe and be sure that all are accounted for after the parade. Once the children are safely inside, the parents will be invited in to take group photos of their children directly behind their classrooms. Parents are asked to sign their child out before proceeding to pick them up from their classroom.

**PLEASE NOTE:** If the ghosts and goblins bring rain on this day, the parade will be canceled. If this happens, parents will be invited to take pictures in the classroom from 3:30-3:45 only.



## **\*IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING DISMISSAL ON HALLOWEEN!!**

Parents, please be advised that it has been our experience that most parents take their child home with them after the parade to prepare for evening trick-or-treating festivities. Historically, this leaves but 3 or 4 children at school after 5:00. Parents concerned that their child may be disoriented by being one of the few children left, may want to consider planning on taking their child with them after the parade or picking them up by 5:00 on this special Halloween day.

### **MONTESSORI 101 (OCTOBER 6th)**

Save the date for Montessori 101! We have found that it is about this time that parents would like to know more about what their children are doing and why. What is the thing with rolling rugs, carrying trays, and those pink blocks - when will they be reading and can they work with numbers?

The presentation will be held on October 6, 2016 from 5:30-6:30 PM at our Village Montessori School (4552 Sandburg Way, Irvine, CA 92612) which is home to our primary program. Babysitting is available at registration time and a light snack will be available for parents as well as children.

### **SNACKS**

Morning snack is a part of your child's "practical life" learning experiences at school and is a popular aspect of our parent participation program. Parents sign up for their child to be a host or hostess for the day and bring in a special nutritious snack for their child's class. When signing up, please **be sure to list** what snack items you are planning to bring (from at least 2 food groups). Please be sure to have snack at school **BY 8:30 a.m.** so it can be prepared and ready to serve by 9:00. Ideas for snack are available in the front office as is a full copy of our snack policy.

**Please note:** Nut allergies pose a **potential FATAL effect** due to severe allergies to peanuts and nuts. Even if the nuts are not eaten, sheer exposure can bring an allergic reaction. Thus **ALL PEANUTS, NUTS AND NUT PRODUCTS ARE NOT ALLOWED AT SCHOOL**. Please check labels for peanut oil and by products.

## **PARENT CONFERENCES AND PROGRESS REPORTS**

Parent-Teacher conferences for preschool, kindergarten and primary grades are scheduled for 20-minute sessions twice a year. Parents sign up for a time that is convenient for them on a first-come-first-served basis. Two days have been scheduled for your convenience. Regular Montessori classes will not be in session during this time. Daycare activities will be available.

Registration for conferences will begin on Wednesday, October 26. All parents are encouraged to schedule a conference, as there *will not* be a scheduled make-up day. Please check the November newsletter for more information!

A copy of your child's progress report will be in your child's Friday folder on Friday, October 28. Please take the time to review this progress report **BEFORE** your scheduled conference time. Feel free to make notes or jot down questions to bring with you to your conference. With your child's progress report you will receive a parent questionnaire to share your thoughts about your child's school experiences and ensure that the teacher is able to address these during the conference. Please complete this form and return it to the front desk for your child's teacher before conference day. ### Spaghetti Dinner Recipe

3 T olive oil  
1 yellow onion diced  
1 T crushed garlic  
½ c chopped basil  
½ c chopped thyme  
½ c chopped oregano  
1 t cracked black pepper

1 c marsala wine  
1 pound ground meat, browned and strained  
2- 8 oz. cans of tomato sauce  
1- 8 oz. can tomato juice  
1 T tomato paste  
1 pound pasta noodles, cooked

In a stock pot heat olive oil, add onions and garlic. Add all dry ingredients. Add marsala wine and boil until half of the liquid is reduced. Add beef, tomato sauce, tomato juice and tomato paste. Simmer for 20 minutes. Add sauce to noodles and mix. Cover and heat in the oven at 200° for 15 minutes. (Optional: top with fresh grated parmesan cheese)

Helpful Hints!

1. Bring your child to school in school clothes.
2. Bring a BROWN PAPER BAG with your child's name clearly printed on the outside. Put their Halloween costume in the bag. Please LABEL all pieces!! NO masks please!
3. The parking lot will be blocked off from 2:30-4:30. Please do not park in the lot if you need to leave between these times!
4. Preschool and Kindergarten children will parade in the parking lot at 3:30. For the children's safety, please stand only in the designated parade route in the parking lot and keep the front entrance and entry way clear at all times!
5. We invite parents to take both still and video pictures on this day, however, please do so outside and during the parade only.
6. There will be an opportunity for group photos on the side yard for Miss Elisa's, Miss Mitch's, Miss Corey's, and Miss Lily's class directly behind their classrooms. Miss Nicole's class and Miss Karina's class group photos will be directly behind their classrooms.
7. After the parade all children will be behind their classrooms shortly for photos then **return to their classrooms**. For safety reasons, please DO NOT take your child from the parade. Please wait outside until ALL children have returned indoors, then you may enter the building to pick up your child. This helps to keep them safe and be sure that all children are accounted for after the parade.
8. Remember to sign your child out if you are taking your child home after the parade. Look for a sign out sheet with your child's teacher in the classroom. \*Parents, please be advised that our experience has been that most parents take their child home with them after the parade to prepare for the evening trick-or-treating festivities. If you do not want your child to be with a very small handful of children who remain, please plan to pick up your child BY 5:00 p.m.
9. Just a reminder: If ghosts and goblins should bring rain on this day, the parade will be canceled. If the parade is canceled, parents are invited to take pictures in the classroom from 3:30-3:45 pm only.
