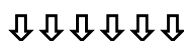

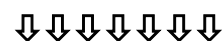
After your child's performance, please join us in the atrium and enjoy some holiday cookies.

What will you do on recess? Here are a few ideas:

1. Go to **Build a Bear** – then donate it to the Salvation Army who will give to a child “in need”. Salvation Army has a church at 10200 Pioneer Road Tustin, CA 92782 - 714.832.7100. They would LOVE to have a few bears!
2. Invite 2 other families over and bake different kinds of cookies! Then have a **cookie exchange**.
3. Use your iPad and record a children's play **starring your child!**
4. Have a family pizza party – with **homemade pizza (or almost homemade)**. Make or buy pizza dough and top it with all your favorites. (Don't forget the veggies!)
5. Go to a public library and show the children **how a real library works!** Get a free library card!
6. Go to an art museum! Museums expose children to new ideas and visions and help develop **higher critical and creative thinking skills!**
7. **Ride the train to Los Angeles** and shop in **Chinatown**. Eat dim sum at Express Pavilion or Ocean Seafood where you can pick what you want from steaming carts. Then shop for knick-knacks and souvenirs. Even have desert from one of the great bakeries!
8. **Ride the train to Los Angeles** and shop at **Olvera Street**. Olvera Street is home to dozens of craft shops, restaurants and businesses with roving troubadours. The exterior facades of the brick buildings enclosing Olvera Street and on the small vendor stands lining its center are colorful piñatas, hanging puppets, Mexican pottery, serapes, mounted bull horns, and oversized sombreros. Olvera Street attracts almost two million visitors per year who can find the customs and trades of the Mexican and Latino traditions of Los Angeles commemorated in a walkable outdoor shopping mall.
9. When was the last time you went **bowling?!** It is a hoot with the children! Use bumpers for the young ones at Irvine Lanes.
10. Buy some Prismacolor colored pencils from Michael's and learn some special techniques at <https://www.art-is-fun.com/colored-pencil-instruction/> - Children can make their own **thank you notes** to send!
11. Get out some blankets, put on your jammies, pop some HOME MADE POPCORN and snuggle up in front of the TV to **watch the Polar Express** – maybe even **ride the Polar Express** – there is a great one in Arizona (Grand Canyon Railway Express - <https://www.thetrain.com/special-events/the-polar-express/>). DAY CARE DAY – FRIDAY, DECEMBER 22

Friday, December 22 is our last day of school for 2017! As our teachers use that day to prepare for the coming semester, our children's activities will be focused on play and fun and will function as a "day care only" day for all children. Snacks and lunch will be served as usual. Montessori lessons and daily routines will begin again upon our return in January 2018!

EXTRA CLOTHES – FRIDAY, DECEMBER 22!

On Friday, December 22 all extra clothes will be sent home. Please check your child's bag and make sure the clothes still fit your growing children and are appropriate for colder weather. Please send replacements back on Monday, January 8, 2018 and be sure to put your **child's name** on all items!

BITING

Some of our youngest children are growing up and moving from our toddler area into our preschool classrooms. These youngest children, while quite used to being at school are now in a room with many more children and a multitude of new activities to explore. As they make this important transition, they are also making new friends. During these times, as they problem solve when things do not work out as they think they would, for example when they are not sure how to ask another child to play with them, they may become stressed or resort to acts such as biting to get a child's attention. This toddler behavior sometime resurfaces during transition times but disappear as the adjustment to preschool settles in. Teachers work closely with the families to reinforce proper social engagement and using language for problem solving. Please be patient with our youngest friends if they have chosen to bite your child. We promise we are working through these times in the most appropriate ways.

Our policy for injurious behavior is to first redirect the behavior but when it is ongoing a child may be asked to suspend their attendance until they can cope in the classroom. Parents who wish to know who a child who is having difficulty is, we apologize, but due to privacy issues we are unable to share that information. Please trust us to know that we are acting on it.

COLD AND FLU SEASON

It is that time of year again. We hope that your family will have a healthy winter! However, if your child does come down with a cold or flu, please remember that state licensing does not permit us to allow children to attend school if they show **ANY** signs of illness. **CHILDREN MUST REMAIN HOME THE ENTIRE FOLLOWING SCHOOL DAY (WITHOUT EXCEPTION) AFTER BEING SENT HOME DUE TO SIGNS OF ILLNESS.** The additional rest time helps them to fully recover, builds their resistance, and also helps prevent the spreading of illness to other children. All children who are healthy enough to be at school must be able to participate in both inside *and* outside activities and should thus be dressed accordingly.

School officials can administer **prescription medication** (such as ongoing antibiotics for bacterial infections) **only!** If your child requires continued medication during the day upon their return to school, parents will need to complete a medication form at the front desk. Please note that ALL information must be completed and the forms signed by the parent before we are allowed to dispense the medicine. Over-the-counter medication that masks signs of illness will require school personnel to send the child home due to the contagious nature of symptoms these medications attempt to cover.

WHITE CHOCOLATE TING-A-LINGS

INGREDIENTS

- 3½ c. chow mein noodles
- 2½ c. salted cocktail peanuts (optional) or craisins
- 32 oz. white chocolate candy coating, vanilla chips or candiquik
- Holiday candy sprinkles

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Mix chow mein noodles and peanuts or craisins in a large bowl.
2. Melt white chocolate over low heat until smooth; add chow mein noodles and mix well.
3. Drop by spoonful onto wax paper; top with candy sprinkles.
4. Cool completely and store at room temperature.
