What will you do with the children during recess? Here are a few ideas:

1. Pull out old magazines and choose funny pictures from ads – make up stories with your children about the people in the pictures (not the products!)
2. Help your children create a play from their favorite picture book starring your child
3. Make costumes for the play
4. Make scenery for the play
5. Record the drama and post your creations on Facebook
6. Bake ginger bread or angel food cake (cake mix absolutely OK!)
7. Plant a tree – if it is evergreen decorate it with birdfeeders for the winter
8. Make birdfeeders for the birds
9. Go to the library or a bookstore and take home a book about Southern California backyard birds
10. Purchase binoculars to watch the birds
11. Take pictures of the birds you see and make a book with their species
12. Take a nature walk and see what birds you can identify
13. Make donuts with lots of sprinkles
14. Check out family toys with your children – outgrown a few? Donate them to the Salvation Army for less fortunate children.
15. Ask your children what they would like to do!



BROWN PAPER BAG DAY- Wednesday, December 19

Friday, December 21 is our last day of session until Monday, January 7, 2019. Please send a **BROWN PAPER GROCERY BAG** to school on **WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 19** so that all holiday projects can be taken home.

EXTRA CLOTHES – FRIDAY, DECEMBER 21!

On Friday, December 21 all extra clothes will be sent home in your child's brown paper bag. Please check your child's bag and make sure the clothes still fit your growing children and are appropriate for colder weather. DAY CARE DAY – FRIDAY, DECEMBER 21

Friday, December 21 is our last day of school for 2018! As our teachers use that day to prepare for the coming semester, our children's activities will be focused on play and fun and will function as a "daycare only" day for all children. Snacks and lunch will be served as usual. Montessori lessons and daily routines will begin again upon our return in January 2019!

JACKETS, SWEATERS AND COATS

We do encourage your child to put on their coat when the weather is cooler, however, they do not always leave them on. Please help us by reinforcing this message at home.

COLD AND FLU SEASON

It is that time of year again. We hope that your family will have a healthy winter! However, if your child does come down with a cold or flu, please remember that state licensing does not permit us to allow children to attend school if they show **ANY** signs of illness. **CHILDREN MUST REMAIN HOME THE ENTIRE FOLLOWING SCHOOL DAY (WITHOUT EXCEPTION) AFTER BEING SENT HOME DUE TO SIGNS OF ILLNESS.** The additional rest time helps them to fully recover, builds their resistance, and also helps prevent the spreading of illness to other children. All children who are healthy enough to be at school must be able to participate in both inside *and* outside activities and should thus be dressed accordingly.

School officials can administer **prescription medication** (such as ongoing antibiotics for bacterial infections) **only!** If your child requires continued medication during the day upon their return to school, parents will need to complete a pink medication form at the front desk. Please note that ALL information must be completed and the forms signed by the parent before we are allowed to dispense the medicine. Over-the-counter medication that masks signs of illness will require school personnel to send the child home due to the contagious nature of symptoms these medications attempt to cover.

Christmas Sugar Cookie Pie



Ingredients

- 1** pouch (1 lb. 1.5 oz) Betty Crocker™ sugar cookie mix
- 1/2** cup butter, softened
- 1** egg
- 1/4** cup red, green and white candy sprinkles
- 1 1/2** cups powdered sugar
- 3** tablespoons of butter softened
- 1/2** teaspoon vanilla
- 3** to 4 teaspoons milk
- Assorted holiday candies

Steps

- 1** Heat oven to 325°F. Spray bottom only of 9-inch pie plate with cooking spray.
- 2** In large bowl, mix cookie mix, 1/2 cup softened butter and egg with spoon until soft dough forms. Stir in candy sprinkles. Press dough in bottom of pie plate.
- 3** Bake 33 to 38 minutes or until center is set and edges are golden brown. If needed, cover edges of cookie with foil to keep from overbrowning. Cool completely, about 1 1/2 hours.
- 4** In medium bowl, beat powdered sugar, 3 tablespoons softened butter, the vanilla and 3 teaspoons of the milk with electric mixer on low speed until smooth and creamy. If necessary, add additional milk to make frosting easy to spread.
- 5** Spread frosting over cookie pie. Decorate top of frosted cookie as desired with assorted holiday candies. To serve, cut into wedges.
