FEBRUARY is National Dental Health Month. Remember to brush and floss!



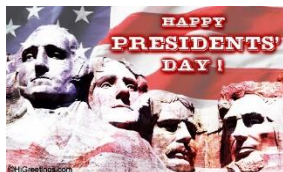
AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

PRE-REGISTRATION FOR THE 2020-21 SCHOOL TERM!

All of us at Montessori Schools of Irvine thank you for the privilege of sharing the precious moments of your child's early childhood years with us.

While it is hard to believe, it is already time to plan for your child's coming year with pre-registration for continuing enrollment. Pre-registration allows us to guarantee your child's placement in the coming year. Pre-registration forms for students are being distributed in Friday folders and forms are available in the front office if you need an additional copy.



PRE-REGISTRATION FOR PRESCHOOL AND INFANT/TODDLER REQUIRED FOR CONTINUED ENROLLMENT

Continuing **preschool and infant-toddler registration begins February 10 and continues to February 21.** (University Montessori School ONLY gives a priority to UC, Irvine staff, faculty and full time students). We ask **ALL** families to complete a registration form, even if you are not continuing for the coming year, so that we can plan accordingly. Pre-registration for continued enrollment **CLOSES on February 21**, after which time any child not registered will be removed from the July class lists and registration will be open to those on our waiting list. Transfer requests from our other schools will be dated and timed and accepted for openings that become available after our first week of in-school registration. PRE-REGISTRATION FOR KINDERGARTEN AND 1ST THROUGH 3RD GRADE!

Enrollment for Kindergarten and the Primary grades is on a ***first come, first served basis***. Registration begins on **February 10** (University Montessori School ONLY gives a priority to UC, Irvine staff, faculty and full time students). Registration closes on **February 21**. We ask ALL families to please return a registration form, even if you are not continuing for the coming year, so that we can plan appropriately. You can register by returning the registration form and the enrollment fee. Please note that all fees are NON-REFUNDABLE even if you should withdraw your child for any reason. *Children must continue attendance through the summer session in order to remain enrolled in September.*

PRIMARY GRADES AT VILLAGE MONTESSORI

Last year, due to the demonstrated strength of our Montessori curriculum and program for first through third grade, we had to modify our program to adjust to the increasing enrollment. We have thus added amenities supporting a progressive learning environment for all of our schools in the kindergarten rooms but also expanded the classroom amenities for **first through third grade at our Village Montessori School**, across from the University Park library and park.

KINDERGARTEN ELIGIBILITY

The State of California, and thus the state public school system, requires that children be 5 years old **BY SEPTEMBER 1, 2020** to attend kindergarten for the 2020-2021 school year. Montessori Schools of Irvine adhere to the state entry level age for Kindergarten, as the public school system continues this cutoff date for first grade entry and above.

Please note: Children who are eligible to enroll in kindergarten are required by the state to have a birth certificate on file. Children who attend our kindergarten are also evaluated for their developmental strengths by Chancy & Bruce Educational Services. This evaluation is required as a part of the registration process. This is not an entrance exam or IQ test! It is simply a standardized documentation of your child's development and learning style strengths as they progress into the next phase of their education. Evaluations of this type are also a criterion for our ongoing NAEYC Accreditation.

A note about:

"TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN" from the Executive Director, Cheryll Ruszat

Since 2012 when the State of California began moving the cut-off age earlier for Kindergarten enrollment, the public school system has offered a "transitional kindergarten" TK program for children

whose birthdays are between September and December as an option for children who would have previously been eligible for school entry to help parents cope with the change. This was also the state's attempt to provide a universal preschool option for some parents. Transitional kindergarten is NOT early entry into kindergarten. The law states: "A child who completes one year in a transitional kindergarten program, *shall continue in a kindergarten program for one additional year.*" Transitional kindergarten is, in fact, PRE kindergarten or PREschool!! Please note that TK programs are half day programs (3 hours and 20 minutes a day) with class size the same as public school Kindergarten (maximum of 33 children with one teacher) and a curriculum focusing on skills your children have already acquired from their experiences in Montessori. Also, programs are offered at centralized school district sites which are finalized after enrollment numbers are determined and may not be your child's home school. Please contact your local school district for more information.

Montessori early childhood classes are designed for children ages 3-6 – a three-year span which includes "transitional kindergarten" curriculum and is geared to individualized learning at a broader scope. Each year your child grows and works at a higher level – they are not doing the same thing every year! The Montessori curriculum provides a much more comprehensive preparation for later learning which is why children who stay longer in a Montessori environment of teaching demonstrate stronger learning skills in later grades. Research supports the fact that children who transition from the early childhood program into kindergarten at the appropriate age excel throughout their education and in life. (Science 29 September 2006, Vol. 313, no.5795, pp. 1893-1894)

PRIORITY PLACEMENT

Enrollment at each school is on a priority basis to those children already attending that school. Parents wishing to transfer to another one of our school locations need to register only at their **current** school at the beginning of that school's registration date. Children must be registered to continue at their current school in order to be eligible to transfer to another location. Please **mark on your registration form** that you are **requesting a transfer**. Directors will transfer enrollment on an availability and first come, first served basis with transfer spaces open after the first week of in-school registration.

TUITION RATES FOR THE COMING YEAR

The staff and administration at Montessori Schools of Irvine are very aware of the challenges of today's economy. Like you, we also look at managing the budget to be able to provide the services we have promised you within the financial challenges presented to us. As we look at our projections for the coming year, we share with you that our focus is to continue to provide the high quality of education that you expect. Like you, we continue to have increased expenses. Our contracts with staff guarantee an annual increase in salary, as well as additional costs to maintain high quality employee benefits. Our vendors that supply materials have also informed us of increases, especially in food cost increases for our lunch program. While we will need to cover these increases to maintain the high educational standards of the school, we will do everything we can to be mindful of the economic situation before us. The tuition rates for the **current 2019-2020 school year** which ends August 31, 2020 are: \$1,875 for infants, \$1,825 for toddlers, \$1,545 for full day preschool, \$1,575 for Kindergarten and \$1,595 for Primary. We anticipate that the increase for the 2020-2021 school year will be no more than approximately 5% per month. We will make every effort to keep our quality and services better and tuitions costs comparable or below that of other surrounding programs. PARENT WORKSHOP - Chancy & Bruce developmental assessment RESULTS

The parent workshop for the Educational Resources developmental assessment results for children entering Kindergarten this fall will be held on February 10 at 6:30 p.m. Your child's individual results will be available to you at the beginning of the meeting so you can refer to them as the developmental areas are explained. A representative from Chancy & Bruce Developmental Service will not only be explaining kindergarten developmental documentation and how children learn, she will also be available to answer questions regarding your child's evaluation results. If your child participated in the assessment, please try to attend this important workshop! While a representative will not be at our school other than at the meeting to explain the results or questions, you can pick up any remaining screening results at the front desk the following morning.

Baby-sitting is available for all children 2 1/2 years and older (toilet taught). The cost is \$5 per child. Please register yourselves and your child, as this will help us to provide adequate staff and seating. Signups are now posted in the front office. Please pay the staff member who is baby-sitting at the door upon your arrival.

Bonnie Bruce, the founder of Chancy & Bruce Developmental Service, holds a M.Ed. in Early Childhood Special Education and has taught in both private and public schools. She directs an Institute for Child Development. Since the early 1980's Mrs. Bruce has been in private practice working with over 200 Early Childhood Centers in Southern California. She lectures throughout Southern California on the subject of development and the correlation for school success.



LOVE AND THE PEACE ROSE

Montessori Education assists children in the process of learning to problem solve effectively. The Montessori Peace Rose is a curriculum which encourages children to learn to share, listen, and understand another person's point of view and work cooperatively with others to solve problems. Constructing knowledge by making mistakes is a part of the natural process of learning to solve problems. Disagreements between children are an inevitable type of "mistake" that children make that they can learn and grow from.

There is a Montessori Peace Rose in every classroom and the children are taught how to handle and care for the rose. When a conflict arises, one child takes the peace rose and while holding the rose, expresses what their problem was with a situation with another child. When they are finished expressing their point of view, they pass the rose to the other child who has their chance. They continue to pass the rose back and forth making their individual "I" statements ("I" felt sad when you wouldn't do that job with me!) and listening with respect until a solution is solved or they simply are over the difficulty. When done, the children both put their hands on the peace rose and say, "We declare peace!"

This very simple method of practicing problem solving reinforces treating each other respectfully and with care as well as the idea that freedom comes with some boundaries that keep everyone safe. It also removes the teacher from the center of a conflict and instead puts the dispute and resolution back between the children involved and promotes the development of skills that will last them a life time.

On Valentine's Day, each classroom will be doing a special peace rose presentation to their class. **Please remember to ask your child about their peace rose.** *It works at home with families just as well as with classroom communities!*



VALENTINE EXCHANGE FOR PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN-PRIMARY

The preschool-primary children will all participate in a valentine exchange on **Friday, February 14**. Please bring in your child's valentines no later than Thursday, February 6 and **FOLLOW THE "HELPFUL HINTS" BELOW:**

PRESCHOOL: Bring in approximately 30 valentines. Help your child SIGN THE BACK OF THE VALENTINE ONLY (at home!). **PLEASE DO NOT** address the envelopes to the children in the class. On Valentine's Day each child will pass out their own valentines to their classmates without having to recognize each name.

KINDERGARTEN-PRIMARY: Bring in 27 valentines. Each child will **sign** and **address** their own valentines **in class** as a class project and distribute them on Valentine's Day.

A special AM Snack Sign Up for Valentine's Day will be posted on Wednesday, February 5.



PANCAKE DAY AND PJ'S

Tuesday, February 25 is "National Pancake Day" and Pajama Day! This is an easy morning - everyone comes dressed in their pajamas or can wear their clothes backwards. Pancakes will be served for lunch. Sorry, **no slippers** on this day as the children will be playing outside!

PARKING AND SAFETY

PLEASE!!!! Keep your children and others safe in our parking lot by slowing down, being aware and PARKING IN THE CORRECT PARKING PLACES. Please DO NOT LEAVE ANY CHILDREN ALONE IN THE CAR! Please also turn your car off when you walk your child into the school.

Also, if you are parking on the street in front of the school, police have been ticketing in the morning due to it being a "loading" zone only. Please be aware!

ILLNESS POLICY

The State Regulations require that every child arriving at school should be healthy and feeling good. Children showing any signs of illness are asked to remain home until signs and symptoms are gone. If your child develops any signs of illness during the school day, you will be contacted immediately. Children being sent home with signs of illness must remain home FOR THE FOLLOWING DAY OF SCHOOL AND until all signs of illness are gone. For more detailed information, please see our school Brochure. Some illnesses will require a longer "stay-home" time. While we try to send home a written illness reminder, we sometimes "miss" you, however, the policy remains. Please notify the school *immediately* of any illnesses your child has been diagnosed with or possibly exposed to.

Chef's Corner by Chef Cyndi

SWEETHEART FINGER SANDWICHES



INGREDIENTS

- 2 slices white or whole wheat bread (makes one sandwich)
- 1 tbsp (15 mL) cream cheese
- 1 tbsp (15 mL) **Smucker's** Pure Raspberry Jam or any type of jam or jelly
- **Optional:** Fill with any kind of sandwich filling; cheese, chicken salad, almond butter etc.
- You will need: Heart shaped cookie cutters, one large, one small

DIRECTIONS

Remove crusts from bread and cut out a 3.5" (9cm) heart with a heart shaped cookie cutter from each slice. Spread one heart with cream cheese and top with jam. Punch a smaller heart (2"/5cm) into second slice of bread and place on top of jam to form a sandwich. Press down slightly
